
Since the last newsletter we have been advised of a DVA Commemoration for the 50th anniversary of the conclusion of Australian operations in South Vietnam. The commemoration will be held on Anzac Parade at the Vietnam Memorial on Friday 18 August 2023. The event is being coordinated by the Department of Veteran's Affairs and will involve the entire ex-service community. We are not privy to the full details of the event at this time, but in the interim the XO will work with state reps to determine the numbers attending with an intent to have an informal gathering on the afternoon of the 17th in order to catch up before the commemoration. It will be a busy week in Canberra with parliament sitting, so accommodation will be a premium. Those interested in attending may wish to book accommodation soon.

Plans for the 7 RAR parade on Saturday 30 September 2023 are developing. As advised in the last newsletter, the Battalion has been awarded a campaign honour for operations in Iraq.

The campaign honour has been sewn onto the Regimental Colour in recent weeks and the parade on 30 September will provide an opportunity for a formal ceremonial event with the new campaign honour. The

program is being refined, but it will include an opportunity for Association members to visit the Battalion on the afternoon of Friday 29 September. The visit will include a short ceremony to officially name the Battalion's military instruction block and a viewing of the historical collection. The parade will occur at the Torrens Parade Ground in North Adelaide on the Saturday morning. It is planned to commence mid morning and conclude well before midday giving all guests an opportunity to enjoy a BBQ lunch and drinks on site. We are deliberately leaving the Friday and Saturday evenings free of any formal events in order to allow mates to catch-up informally. 2023 is a year of multiple anniversaries including 50 years since to conclusion of Australian involvement in Vietnam, 15 years since the first 7 RAR lraq tours, 15 years since the first 7 RAR led Afghanistan tour and 10 years since the second 7 RAR led Afghanistan tour.



INTRODUCTION

3 August 2023 marks 60 years since the deployment/arrival of the Australian Army Training team (AATTV) in South Vietnam (SVN) and 50 years since the combat troops withdrew.

It is noted that the Australian Government intends to mark the occasion with a Commemorative Service, televised nationally by the ABC on the 18 August 2023 from the Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial (AVFNM) in Canberra.

The majority of Vietnam Veterans, through, age and ill-health, will not be able to attend. They see this ceremony as one that is primarily VIPs from Government, Defence and (Ex Service Organisations Round Table (ESORT) members. It will not be a 'hands-on' event for the Diggers nor for all the families whose loved ones paid the supreme price in the name of 'national interest'. though a token representation of Vietnam Veterans (VV) may be present)

The VVV will provide the Vietnam Veterans and the Australian community the opportunity to participate in a meaningful way right across the nation and overseas in recognizing the national loss and paying their respects to those who were Killed in Action (KIA) and to show solidarity with their loved ones for their loss.

PURPOSE

To provide a meaningful and poignant opportunity for Vietnam Veterans and the public to visit the grave-sites/memorials of all 523 VV recognized by Department of Veterans Affairs (and named by the Australian War Memorial on their Roll of Honour) who were KIA or died soon thereafter from wounds received whilst on active service in SVN. And in conjunction with surviving family members, commemorate a life that cut short.

METHOD

A public media campaign will be launched to invite Vietnam Veterans, the NOK/surviving family members, veterans and the general public to choose a specific service member listed within the 523 KIA and to visit their final resting place and, at 11am on the 3 August 2023, lay a flower and read a short, prepared Service of Remembrance in their memory and to pray for their loss and for those they left behind.

To achieve this:

The surviving former Committee members of the Australian Vietnam Forces Welcome Home Parade 1987/Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial Committee, will: establish a website; provide the lead and centrally coordinate the Media Releases; provide the names and cemetery locations of those who will be commemorated; provide the Service of Remembrance template; locate the relatives of those KIA; arrange local publicity; and coordinate the acceptances of those wishing to participate.

They will request the participants to send in Photographs capable of being uploaded onto the Virtual War Memorial Australia www.vwma.org.au website of their attendance and the paying of respects to the Fallen at every grave/memorial site.


END STATE

The grave of every VV KIA will be visited and photographed. The photographs will be downloaded to a central data base and made publicly available before the Commemorative Service in Canberra at the AVFNM on the 18 August 2023. The ABC will be invited to review the photographs and possibly incorporate some into a prelude to their national broadcast on that day.

The VVV will begin at Dawn at the Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial. And whilst the Service will commemorate all those who served, suffered or died, it will focus on the Memorial seats erected for the 6 MIA's, and how they were 'never forgotten' by the Vietnam Veterans and how Vietnam Veterans played a central role in 'bringing them Home'.

We are looking at a GET TOGETHER on the Thursday 17 August. More details when we get a overall plan for the period, this will be covered by the early release of the August Seven News.



You should all be aware that KARL Metcalf has formatted a book for the battalions 1ST Tour in Vietnam 1967-68. Currently the book is being proof read and should be ready for final print in June. This book tells the history









of the Seventh Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment (7 RAR) during its first tour in South Vietnam. The book primarily uses images to tell this story, whether they be photographs, artwork, maps, or newspaper cuttings. As the title of the book states, it is about Porky's People and the priority for selection of images has been the people who served in or supported the battalion.


The book is set out generally in chronological order so that the reader can easily follow the sequence of events. The scope of the book covers the period from the raising of the battalion through to the time it returned to Australia and the immediate aftermath.


Each operation has its own chapter with an accompanying map. A short introduction to each operation is provided — sufficient for the reader to understand what the operation was about and the key events. For some operations there are a large number of photographs and these chapters are necessarily much longer than other operations that have few, if any, photographs. Newspaper articles have been selected on the basis that they directly describe 7 RAR activities or people, or they provide relevant background information.

Included also is a nominal roll of the 1251 infantrymen listed by DVA as having served with Lt. Col. Eric Smith's Battalion. This comprehensive publication is a testament to them all and to those who supported the Battalion throughout that exhausting year. Karl, you've done the 7th Battalion and the Association proud.


This is a remarkably good book in both quality and content.


Recently, I had the pleasant task of proof-reading Karl Metcalf's *Porky's People* manuscript, an historical and pictorial account of 7RAR's first tour in South Vietnam. This book follows on from Karl's excellent 2nd edition of *Seven in Seventy* and whilst in the same genre, *Porky's People* is a much more detailed account of the Battalion's 1st tour.

Unlike some recent civilian authors writing about the Vietnam War from an Australian perspective (and getting it wrong!) Karl Metcalf was a Platoon Commander during the Battalion's second tour. His experiences coupled with an enquiring mind have equipped him with the knowledge and skills to navigate the intricacies of records held by the Australian War Memorial and other sources, including input from former members of 7 RAR.

Karl has been methodical in his research and has not been content with merely cross checking information and adding footnotes. After Action Reports, NOTICAS forms, awards' recommendations and citations, newspaper reports and many other sources are reproduced in this book, together with a wide range of photographs. For example, how many members of the Battalion knew that 7 RAR soldiers were "loaned" to the US Army's 155mm self-propelled battery supporting the Battalion? Or, how much thought did we give at the time to battle casualties and their impact on people back in Australia? To grasp this side of the War, Karl has delved into the procedures and experiences of one family's loss, even re-producing the impersonal (and much dreaded) telegram delivered from the Department of Army to Next of Kin.

As a 2nd tour soldier, I knew very little about 1st tour's operations and, reading Karl's book I am left with the impression that the two tours were very different experiences. For example, the 1st tour engaged in Cordon and Search operations at Hoa Long and Binh Ba, and the reader is left with the impression that whilst these operations were deemed an important tactic by commanders, they were not popular with soldiers.

Perhaps, Cordon and Search did win some Vietnamese "Hearts and Minds" because, on at least one occasion several Diggers found themselves sharing rice wine with a local villager in his home. Just maybe, this anecdote says more about the decency and ingenuity of Australian soldiers, than the value of these operations, *per se*.

Porky's People is the soldiers' story of 7 RAR's 1st tour of South Vietnam and it deserves to be recorded for posterity. Families will now have a much better understanding of what took place during their relatives' 1st tour of SVN. The wider Australian community, on the other hand, will read about an Infantrymen's experiences of war in South Vietnam during, we should never forget, Australia's largest deployment of ground troops on Active Service since the Second World War.

PORKY PEOPLE'S BOOK

7RAR was represented by Ian Dunn and Bill Anderson.





Our thoughts and prayers are with Mim and all of Roo's family. An invitation has been extended to join us whenever she is able.



Melbourne ANZAC Day March & Reunion (25 April)







It has now been opened up to all Veterans, Police, Fire Service and any Armed services who are still serving and who have served with the emergency services and armed forces. More details will follow.









his wife Adriana had been strong supporter s of the Qld branch of the association for many years and he will be sorely missed.


