

From The President



Dear Members of the Seventh Battalion Association, I am humbled to assume the role of Association President from Mick Garraway and would like to take the opportunity to provide you my perspective on some key issues that I trust will be of interest to you. I also would like to welcome Glen Kuschert as the Association Vice President and offer our commitment to you all to act in the best interests of the Association.

First, I express on behalf of us all, our sincere thanks to Major General Mick Garraway for his tenure as our President and acknowledge the detailed oversight he provided for the Association and the initiatives he progressed for its continued strong standing. On behalf of us all, congratulations Mick on your recent promotion and appointment as the Commander, Multi National Force and Observers in the Sinai. We wish you every success in this demanding mission and environment.

You will all be aware of the Government decision resulting <u>from the recent</u> <u>Strategic</u> Defence Review that the Seventh Battalion is again to be linked with the Fifth Battalion to reform the Fifth/Seventh Battalion, based in Darwin as part of the 1st Brigade. While I make no comment on the circumstances of this direction, I acknowledge the disappointment we all share in this surprising development. I am particularly mindful for those of you who served in our Battalion between 1965 and 1973, this is the second time you have witnessed the Seventh Battalion being removed from the Army's Order of Battle through linking.

The role of our Association is therefore even more important to help ensure our unique history, achievements and identity continues to be fostered, acknowledged and celebrated. Those of you who served with the Fifth/Seventh Battalion after linking in 1973 will recall how important it was to ensure key aspects of the Seventh Battalion became part of the fabric of the new Battalion.

I also appreciate from discussions with many of our members of how increasingly important the role of the Association was thereafter. With the impending re-linking to occur in December this year, your continued support





and contribution to our Association will fulfill the same outcome in this next chapter.

The Commanding Officer, Lieutenant Colonel Von Lambert has advised there will be two events to mark the relinking. First will be a 'Farewell from Adelaide Parade' to be held at the Torrens Parade Ground on 26 October to thank the people of Adelaide for their support to the Battalion since relocating from Darwin in 2011. The Commanding Officer noted this will be the final opportunity for the Battalion to parade prior to a smaller internal event on the linking day in Darwin on 3 December. I encourage as many of us as possible to join the Battalion for the Farewell Parade in Adelaide, to celebrate our shared service and meet with the current serving members. Further information will be provided separately as the details are confirmed.

More recently, the Australian War Memorial daily Last Post Ceremony held on 16 March, had one of our own, Corporal Mathew Hopkins as the subject of the ceremony. This occurred at the initiative of Mat's widow, Victoria, on the 15th anniversary of his loss when killed in action in Afghanistan. On behalf of the Association, thank you Victoria for making this moving occasion a reality, the Commanding Officer for his address and so many Seventh Battalion veterans from Vietnam to Afghanistan who attended to mark the occasion. If you missed the event, this can be viewed on the AWM Last Post Ceremonies on You Tube.

Finally, with ANZAC Day soon before us, may I take this opportunity to thank you all for your service to our Nation, the Australian Army and the Seventh Battalion in particular. I hope we can all find some way to participate in a Dawn Service or parade, or personal reflection to remember those we served with but no longer amongst us, are never forgotten.

In closing for this edition, I acknowledge and thank the other members of the Association Executive team for your continued efforts, that includes many years of voluntary

effort and personal time. I look forward to making this contribution to our Association as your President and welcome your counsel and advice.


